

Some comparative facts and figures from the 2013 Budget

Military spending: \$3,259,537,000 (an increase of \$536,416,000 from last year)

Armed forces: \$3,018,902,000Ministry of Defence: \$240,635,000

Official Development Assistance: \$566,732,000

Veteran's pensions and costs of administration: \$167,448,000

Domestic Purposes Benefit (income support for sole parents, caregivers of sick or infirm people or women alone): \$149,349,000

Communications Security and Intelligence (GCSB, SIS and DPMC only): \$103,928,000

- Government Communications Security Bureau (GCSB) \$57,387,000
- Security Intelligence Service (SIS): \$37,699,000
- Payments to the Commissioner of Security Warrants: \$74,000
- Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet (DPMC) leadership, advice, coordination around national security matters: \$8,768,000

Agencies tasked with human rights protection and promotion, and environmental oversight: \$33,474,000

- Law Commission, Human Rights Commission, Independent Police Conduct Authority, the Privacy Commissioner and the Inspector-General of Intelligence and Security: \$20,511,000
- Equity Promotion and Protection Services: Human Rights Commission to advocate and promote respect for, and an understanding and appreciation of, human rights in New Zealand, and encourage the maintenance and development of harmonious relations between individuals and among the diverse groups in New Zealand society; Independent Police Conduct Authority to investigate incidents and investigate and resolve complaints against the Police, and to uphold the rights of persons in Police detention; Privacy Commissioner on privacy issues relating to the collection and disclosure of personal information and the privacy of individuals and Inspector-General of Intelligence and Security to fund administrative support: \$ 0
